5th Ecumenical Pilgrimage for Climate Justice

Zielona Góra – Münster – IJmuiden – Glasgow 14th August - 2nd November 2021



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The 5th Climate Pilgrimage connects the United Nations Climate Change Conference 2018 (Katowice/Poland) with the **United Nations Climate Change Conference 2021** (Glasgow/Scotland). On 14 August 2021, the official 5th Ecumenic Pilgrimage for Climate Justice starts in Zielona Góra in Poland. This starts with a sending off church service to see them on their way through Poland, Germany, the Netherlands and England to Scotland.

The route will take 77 days from Zielona Góra through Forst (Lausitz), Cottbus, Leipzig, Halle (Saale), Göttingen, Detmold, Bielefeld, Münster, Enschede, Borne, Goor, Apeldoorn, Amersfoort, Zeist, Amsterdam, IJmuiden, Newcastle upon Tyne, Edinburgh and Livingston to Glasgow. At the start of COP26 - the UN Climate Change Conference in 2021 - pilgrims from all over the world will come together to call on the international community to act.

On our journey, we will be visiting places that provide good and bad examples of climate protection.

For instance, parishes, environmental initiatives, schools and non- profit associations will inform us of their situation, **organise meetings** or prepare **themed events**. On excursions and through concrete actions and ecumenic devotions, we will seek to begin a dialogue and we want to give fresh impetus for climate protection and climate justice.

Starting on 1st November 2021, there will be negotiations about the implementation of the **Paris Agreement** in Glasgow.

Our demands

mobility revolution

- Transport business: Reduce; handle necessary transport in a climate-friendly way; reduce climate-damaging subsidies
- Local public transport: Develop public transport as a mobility backbone
- Rail transport: Strengthen by investing in infrastructure and reducing costs; "Deutschlandtakt" based on the Swiss model from the ICE to the Regio bus
- Cycling: More space for cycling and pedestrians at the expense of private motorised transport
- Car traffic: Speed limit 120 km/h on motorways, 80 km/h on country roads

agricultural revolution

- Everybody: buy regional, seasonal organic food and buy less meat; participate in food sharing and initiate it.
- Churches: buy regional, seasonal organic food and less meat;
 Church-land to be leased according to ecosocial criteria; offer education on the global impacts of nutrition behaviour; do not support loans for intensive livestock farming.
- Politics: Orient agricultural policy towards sustainable, fairly paid farming; reorient marketing of agricultural products towards the regional, national, European market; introduce livestock farming dependent on space; ensure global access to education and production factors (land, seeds, loans) for smallholder; facilitate pasture slaughter and do not allow livestock to be transported over 100 km; improve organic farming by at least 20% by 2030; establish an animal welfare label.
